The goddess or queen wears a striated tripartite wig surmounted by a rectangular spike for the reception of a crown or emblem. The style of portraiture, though on a minute scale, with the wide open eyes and form of the ear lobes (which are fleshy and triangular) appears to be more typical of Dynasty xxvi than of the Ptolemaic Period.
