Merete Rasmussen's hand-built forms are extraordinary. Her mastery of material propels clay into flight. Smooth undulating lines twist and turn, up, over and under. The form glides and cups space. Its shape changes and shifts depending on your viewing position and its movement is infinite. A vivid matt blue saturates the flawless surface emphasising its dynamic curves. Rasmussen wants the complexity of her work to encourage curiosity in the viewer, these are forms that require time and viewing close-up. Her preliminary process includes making 3D clay maquettes which guide the coilbuilding of the final works. [1]

Rasmussen initially trained and worked as a nurse. Between 2000 and 2005 she studied ceramics at Design School Kolding, Denmark, where her work showed a strong interest in the rhythm and disruption of line. [2] In 2006 she moved to the UK where she continues to work and her practice now also encompasses bronze sculpture.
