The dynamic arrangement of lines in this abstract print has been determined by a system that Malcolm Hughes developed using the prime numbers that occur between one and twenty. The potential of using logical and mathematical processes as a structuring device was central to Hughes' work. In 1969 he co-founded the Systems Group, bringing together artists using rational principles to experiment with a new aesthetic that spanned science, art and mathematics.

This print was created for the Rational Concepts portfolio, which included seven screen prints produced in an edition of 100, by artists associated with constructive art in England. The other artists represented in the portfolio are Norman Dilworth, Anthony Hill, Peter Lowe, Kenneth Martin, Jeffrey Steele and Gillian Wise.
