Maybe there's one in there?



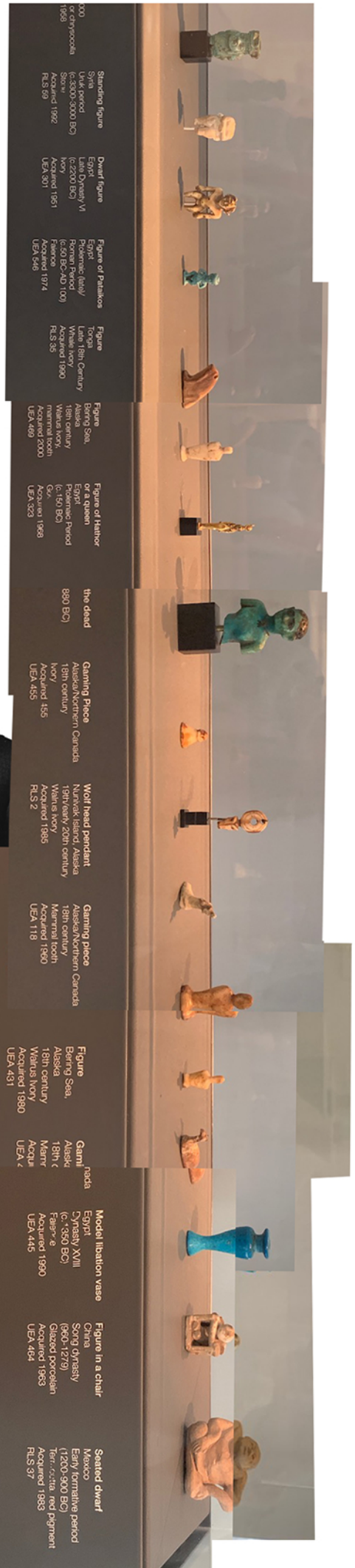
What do you think I told Robert,

On the next page - there are ideas for what you can do...

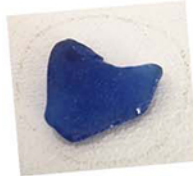
Do you recognise these items in the cabinet in the Living Area?

\* We made up a story which had all the objects in - saying one sentence each at a time -
