DESCRIPTION

Taking inspiration from the carved objects from the Arctic, and elsewhere in the world, pupils will have a go at soap carving, and consider how this material is different to the ivory, wood, and stone which they have seen in the galleries. We will discuss why Arctic people carve from ivory, and how they value their resources. We will think about the materials we use to make things here, and whether we need to prioritise more sustainable alternatives.
