

This spring heralds the first awakenings of a radical reimagining for the Sainsbury Centre Collection. It is fifty years since the original Sainsbury Collection was gifted to the University of East Anglia and that gift was made with rule-breaking intention by its founders. They wanted to create a museum that changed the way art and material culture was experienced and worked

hard to find the creative genius of people like Sir Norman Foster and Kho Liang le to achieve that for the public. Genuine radicality is not an easy thing to create within the established systems and structures of the museum world but if there is one place where it can be achieved, it is the Sainsbury Centre, where it is woven into the DNA of the institution.

Beginning that journey this year is Empowering Art: Indigenous Creativity and Activism from North America's Northwest Coast. This vibrant expression of indigenous culture from across the Northwest Coast of North America is the most ambitious show if its kind for more than fifty years in the UK. Developed in close collaboration with artists. colleagues and friends from across the region, the show's narratives will inform and inspire in equal measure.

Opening soon after will be Julian Stair: Art, Death and the Afterlife, an exhibition which will be an incredibly powerful and emotive experience for visitors. In its first ever public display, Stair's stunning body of work builds on months of dialogue with members of the public and is delicately framed around narratives of life and death that permeate throughout the Sainsbury Centre.

EMPOWERING ART: Indigenous Creativity and Activism from North America's Northwest Coast

12 March - 30 July 2023



Empowering Art is a ground-breaking exhibition of rich but rarely seen artworks, bringing together exceptional contemporary and historical pieces from across the Northwest Coast of North America.

Developed in close consultation with Indigenous artists and community leaders from across the Northwest Coast, Empowering Art showcases the talent of their artistic and cultural creations on a scale unseen in the UK since the 1970s.

Bringing a contested past into the realities of the present, the exhibition tells the story of a coastline with distinctive artistic and cultural traditions, where creative exchange is visible in historical objects but also resonates through contemporary art. The exhibition includes works from renowned Indigenous artists breaking the lens of history, such as Lawrence Paul Yuxweluptun, Marianne Nicolson and Susan Point. as well as a new generation of artists reclaiming the

power of the present, including Morgan Asoyuf, Phil Gray and Danielle Morsette.

JULIAN STAIR: Art, Death and the Afterlife

18 March – 17 September 2023

Leading ceramic artist, Julian Stair, displays an important group of new works in this moving exhibition. Created in response to the global pandemic, Stair's vessels explore contemporary society's relationship to death and ritual. Taking inspiration from archaic pots and grave goods in the Sainsbury Centre Collection, Stair's cinerary jars and abstracted figurative forms invite the viewer to meditate on the intimate relationship between the clay vessel and the human body.

Since 2000, the themes of containment and embodiment have become central to Stair's practice. Stair explores how material culture and artistic practice can engender a new, expressive language to both mediate loss and celebrate life. Positive and uplifting, Stair's exhibition explores humanity's reliance on art as a means to transcend the unknown. Art.

experience, created to offer solace to those experiencing bereavement in these troubling times.


Stair's engagement with the local community has led to the donation of ashes of individuals who died during the pandemic. Donors have expressed their wishes to have these ashes embedded in the clay or contained within Stair's figural jars to create permanent

memorials to their loved ones. With great sensitivity, Stair uses the scale, proportion and material composition of his jars to invoke the physical presence of the deceased.





New Perspectives is a podcast series from the Sainsbury Centre. For each episode of the podcast, we have invited an artist, writer or researcher to share their own reflections and interpretations of the Sainsbury Centre Collection.

Sara Sallam is an Egyptian artist based in the Netherlands. She works with photography, film and writing, often re-appropriating archival material and self-publishing books. Through her work, she reflects on growing up in Egypt, criticising the colonial attitudes embedded in tourism, archaeology, museum practices, and photographic archives that prevent Egyptians from relating to their past.

Her research-based practice focuses on the retelling of history by imagining counternarratives where narration, fiction, and temporal juxtapositions are ways to reclaim and decolonise her ancient Egyptian heritage. sarasallam.com


