WORKSHOP:	Exploring Mayan Relief Carving
ARTIST:	Marnie Hardy
YEAR GROUP:	Key Stage 2
DESCRIPTION:	In this workshop pupils will look closely at relief carvings from Mesoamerica especially Mayan jade pendants, engraved shell discs, and a greenstone Hacha, as well as Ulúa marble vessels.
	We will look at the Mayan codex, and the patterns and glyphs which can be seen carved into the surface of the objects in the gallery, and what these could represent.
	The students will explore different ways of creating an image by taking away material, and will have the opportunity to try creating reliefs in polystyrene and carving with wax.
	We will discuss the properties of these materials in relation to stone, and will look at the wide range of other materials in the galleries which have also been carved.
