

WORKSHOP:	Abby Page
ARTIST:	Animal Masks and Movement
YEAR GROUP:	EYFS/ KS1
DESCRIPTION:	<p>How do you think a creature which is part Eagle and part Wolf would move?</p> <p>In this workshop, led by dancer and choreographer Abby Page, students will explore the movement of animals which can be seen in the galleries. We will imagine the sculptures have come to life. We'll discuss their characteristics and how they could move based on their form.</p> <p>Pupils will participate in lots of dance-based activities which will support their physical development – improving their positional and spatial awareness, as well as their creativity and imagination.</p> <p>We will share the stories of some of the masks in the collection. We will consider the culture and place they have come from, and how they would have been worn and used. We'll look specifically at the wolf mask and think about a traditional Alaskan myth in which birds transform into wolves.</p> <p>Pupils will make and wear masks representing two animals of their choice, and develop a dance to show how their creature might move.</p> <p>This workshop has lots of potential to inspire or link to the study of world cultures, as well as creative writing – stories, songs and more.</p>
