A dynamic programme of exhibitions and projects will enable visitors to investigate and discover their own truths and reveal hidden secrets about the world they thought they knew.

LIQUID GENDER 17 February 2024 – 4 August 2024



Liquid Gender explores the relationship between identity and culture, asking how do we know who we really are?

Featuring the photography, collage and sculptural work of Leilah Babirye, Martine Gutierrez and Laryssa Machada and Antônio Vital Neto Pankararu, the pressures of society are pushed aside and the true self is revealed.

The artists will draw upon personal histories and

pre-colonial traditions from around the world to convey fluid approaches to gender expression and self-identity.

In spring, the exhibition will be added to with new holographic sculptures titled *In the Absence of Evidence, We Create Stories*, from Rashaad Newsome. The sculptures will animate to visualise dialogues between objects in the Sainsbury Centre collection about their past, present and future.

JEFFREY GIBSON

24 February 2024 – 4 August 2024



In his first solo exhibition in a UK museum, Jeffrey Gibson – who will become the first Indigenous solo artist to represent the USA at the Venice Biennale in 2024 – creates a new sitespecific installation for the Sainsbury Centre.

Incorporating murals, paintings, textiles and historical objects, Gibson includes text drawn lyrics, poetry, and his own writing, complete with references to abstraction, fashion and popular culture.

Nineteenth and twentieth century objects from Indigenous cultures of North America selected by the internationally renowned artist, will be shown alongside his works.

Jeffrey Gibson is supported by Stephen Friedman Gallery.

IN EVENT OF MOON DISASTER 17 February 2024 – 4 August 2024



According to a YouGov poll, 16% of the British public believe that the 1969 Apollo 11 moon landing never happened.

'In event of moon disaster' was the title of a speech prepared for President Nixon in case of a catastrophe. The speech was never delivered, but artists Halsey Burgund and Francesca Panetta have used deepfake technology to offer an alternative event,

which will be played back on a vintage television.

Visitors will be immersed in a 1960s living room in an experience which has the power to make audiences reconsider whether we can believe the media we consume.

The artists said: "By using the most advanced techniques available, creating a video using both synthetic visuals and synthetic audio (a "complete deepfake"), we aim to show where this technology is heading – and what some of the key consequences might be."

In Event of Moon Disaster is an MIT Center for Advanced Virtuality Production. The work won an Emmy Award for Interactive Media Documentary in 2021.

THE CAMERA NEVER LIES: CHALLENGING IMAGES THROUGH THE INCITE PROJECT 18 May 2024 – 20 October 2024



The Camera Never Lies: Challenging images through The Incite Project re-evaluates some of the most iconic images of the past 100 years, asking to what extent they have shaped or created a false understanding of major global events.

The exhibition looks at the way photography has been used to present facts, whilst questioning its truth, through photographers such as Don McCullin and Robert Capa.

Photography's ability to convey spectacle quickly is effective, yet can be highly problematic when relied upon too heavily to reveal the full truth. The exhibition will include original photographs from the twentieth century which have come to represent iconic events through their repeated use in print journalism, superseding their original context as illustration to text.

Alongside will be work from artists who use photography to question assumed truths about diverse subjects, including government surveillance, domestic violence, and the effect of conflict on civilian populations.

Curated by Harriet Logan and Tristan Lund, the works in this exhibition are drawn from The Incite Project.

SEDIMENT SPIRIT: THE ACTIVATION OF ART IN THE ANTHROPOCENE Runs until 14 April 2024

This exhibition brings together artworks from the 1960s to the present day which are responding to the climate crisis in all its complexities.

Artworks invite audiences to view the Earth as living being that we play an active part in sustaining. *Sediment Spirit* acts to remind audiences that our home is not just the house or country we reside in, but the Earth itself.

LIVING ART SHARING STORIES EAST END DISPLAY Until Autumn 2024



Highlights from the Sainsbury Centre Collection are presented in a striking display in our East End Gallery. Encouraging new discoveries and methods of engagement, this space enables people to build relationships with living works of art.

This display dramatically reimagines how we can

revitalise the cross-cultural conversations that were established at the foundation of the Sainsbury Centre in the 1970s, as one of the first museum settings that works of art from across six continents were displayed equally and in conversation. 

LIVING AREA AND COLLECTION TOURS & SMARTIFY AUDIO TOURS AND OBJECT RECOGNITION



This season, the Living Area presents exciting new acquisitions including *Spokes*, 2023, a painting by Francesca Mollett, among others.

There is also the dramatic intervention by Paul Cocksedge, whose *Coalescence* hovers suspended above Alberto Giacometti's iconic *Standing Woman*, whilst Claudia Martínez Garay's installation brings together a new painting and sculptures with ancient artefacts from her native Peru.

We see the return of Chaim Soutine, *Lady in Blue* as well as Barbara Hepworth's *Discs in Echelon, version 2* courtesy of the Hepworth Estate; and John Hoyland's great late painting, *Song*, has also joined the display on Long Loan from the John Hoyland Estate.

08 WHAT'S ON

SCULPTURE PARK Open during daylight hours Suitable for all ages



The Sculpture Park is the perfect place to enjoy striking art outdoors all year round, so pick up a trail map from the front desk and explore art, architecture and the natural environment.

This season, we see the return of Leiko Ikemura's *Usagi Kannon*, situated to the south of the Sainsbury Centre. This large figurative bronze sculpture is part human, part animal with rabbit ears and a human face. Usagi is the Japanese word for rabbit or hare and Kannon in Buddhism refers to a Female Bodhisattva of Mercy, regarded as the protector of women and children.

This hybrid character was first created in 2011 in response to the Fukushima nuclear disaster in Japan. With a crying face in mourning, the sculpture is dedicated to the people and living beings who died and suffered losses in the tragedy. *Usagi Kannon* offers shelter through their bellshaped skirt, acting as a protective shrine.

Sainsbury Centre's Chief Curator of Art, Tania Moore, will be in conversation with artist Ro Robertson.

Robertson's *Drench*, inspired by the energy of the tidal zone, sits within the Sainsbury Centre Sculpture Park and their drawing/ painting *Stack* (*Body set in Motion*), which represents a body of water dividing two rocky elements, is displayed in the Living Area.

Working with sculpture, drawing, painting and video, Robertson explores the boundaries of the human body and its environment and works to reclaim a space for LGBTQ+ identity.




